

The Struggling Souls in the Dark Alleys

Behind the glow of city lights, there is a group of people whose existence easily went unnoticed; but they are lost sheep in desperate need of the hope in the gospel – they are the sex workers in the city.

Every week, I visit these sex workers at their working places, from which I get to understand more about their needs. Their working places are not where they reside in, which means that we can only visit them during their working hours. If they welcomed us into their rooms to talk, it means that they have sacrificed some of their hours and income. However, these women are very amiable towards us, even their rejections are with much politeness. Surprisingly, it is easier to engage in a meaningful conversation with them than people we meet during street evangelism!

Lost sheep, aren't we all?

Indeed, their needs are no different to everybody's. They long to be cared for and burdened to be listened to. It broke my heart to hear nightmarish tragedies occurring to one after another woman. These mainland women married off to Hong Kong men, sweated and toiled in household chores, hoping to settle in Hong Kong with their new families. However, marriages turned sour, for one reason or the other, driving their marriage down the road to divorce.

They were taught since childhood – a woman is meant to serve her husband and his family. Failing marriages would bring shame to their family name, so returning to their hometown is unthinkable. However, the academic qualifications and work experience they obtained are not recognised in Hong Kong; the fact that they have not resided in Hong Kong for over seven years means that they are not entitled to any social assistance here. Being single parents with children to support, few opportunities to earn an income come another way. They resorted to enter into the trade of the sex industry to make ends meet, a secret often hidden from their family and children.

"If not for survival, who would resort to such a life!" A lot of times, they sobbed when recounting the miseries, and could not bear to speak anymore. Their every single word tells of a true story of struggling souls trapped in the circumstances. Had they been born in a different circumstance, their lives would probably have run a different course. We and them are but leading wholly different lives. Nevertheless, we are living in the same city, all his beloved lost sheep. May the Lord has mercy upon them, let them see the hope and escape from the downward spiral of a life that sells their precious souls away.

When we first met her in 2011, she was a few months pregnant, worried by the changes in her life pattern and unsure about the future. We helped her to stand on her own feet and seek community service. We accompanied her to the antenatal check ups and acted as her interpreter. By sharing her ups and downs and praying for her, we are thankful to see her beaming with the joy of motherhood and continue to pray that she may attain true hope through knowing Jesus Christ.

We talked to her about Logos Hope, the ship that has brought blessing to many people from different nations. She was looking forward to going on board, but was disappointed when her baby's crying fit rendered the visit impossible. We arranged another trip and she was greatly encouraged by the friendliness of the crew, touching her life with a bit of joy.

When Logos Hope returned this time, a German crew member's visit touched her heart. She treated him Pakistani food and had a good sharing. We were glad God used different people to testify to her and will continue to pray that she would one day accept Jesus as her personal saviour.

Recently I got a new name - Sir Joseph! From every Monday to Thursday afternoon, I couldn't stop hearing kids yelling at me "Sir, Sir, Sir, Sir, Sir, Sir!"

Tabé's Story

In a quiet afternoon on a public holiday, Tabé, a 12-year-old boy who used to come every day after-school, rang on our door bell. I was surprised to see him when I opened the door. "Hey, why are you here, Tabé?" I



expected this talented little football player would say that because he wanted to play football. Instead, he looked down and said, "Sir, I am hungry."

For these two months, I have never realised how important

our after-school programme is to our children until that moment! For some of them, the lunch they got here may be the only meal they could have for the whole day! Tabé was sent to us by his grandma. He walked for a long distance from home, but maybe he did not really have any other choice.

My Boys and I

After-school programme is one of our main ministries in AIDS Hope, serving 30 kids who came from difficult families, to provide them meals and extra tutoring every afternoon. I am now helping with 3 boys in grade 5.

I had thought that serving children would be less challenging compared with other ministries, but I was wrong. A good teacher requires enormous love and patience toward his students. Also it is so difficult to love the children when they are too young to understand your love, and they take everything for granted.

Children are the reminder

It really reminded me of myself when I

was in grade 5! I was never thankful to my teachers when I received love and care from them, and even got mad at them when things did not go according to how I wanted it! I must have driven my teachers crazy 10 years ago!

It also reminded me of God's love for his people, the Israelites and I. How many times we have turned away from Him when things did not go according to the way we want? He gave us the grace and mercy that we do not even deserve to have, still we think it is not enough. However, His love never fails and never gives up. This is the unconditional love of a father has for his child, even his child is too young to understand it.


Now I really want to love my 3 kids and set a good example for them, as how I have been loved before and by my Father.
