Therefore, He has His hand in our work to allow us together with these women in our service to gain a deep understanding of His majestic power.

It is Bella's desire to meet people of godliness and sincerity.

Divorced, having experienced the apathy from her in-laws and slanders from her relatives, Bella lives in a narrow and small cubical apartment with her daughter. She works hard to make a living but she is lonely and exhausted at heart. I could feel all these when I visited Bella last month with Deborah, a Logos Hope crew member. I first take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers and co-workers for their substantial assistance to Bella.

I learnt a lot from Deborah when we visited and showed our care to Bella. I noticed that Bella and Deborah had deep sharing like old friends even though they knew each other



not long ago. The communication between them was natural with emotions sincerely expressed. I wondered how such a beautiful relationship developed. Deborah was born in a single-parent family and she has similar experience with Bella. I also noticed that Deborah was a very good listener. While listening, she seldom displayed strong emotions or commented on Bella's sharing. She quietly provided the space and atmosphere for her to share. Silence and the look of understanding from the listener brings tremendous support and comfort to those who are suffering. This is exactly what sufferers desperately need.

During the time of celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ, we shared the meaning of Christmas through a short play. I prayed that while listening to the song "Oh Holy Night" and looking attentively at the lyrics, Bella would receive the encouragement and comfort from Emmanuel, the fact that God is with us. The lyrics mentioned the birth and salvation of Jesus Christ.)

I needed to raise financial support for my short-term mission trip. I never imagined that it would be so hard and frustrating. Changing the attitude from begging for money to expressing my financial needs to others was a long internal struggle for me. However, through these struggles, God revealed a bigger picture to me. When I shared my financial needs, I realised that I also influenced others to participate in missions. This was God's ultimate objective.

When I was in the orientation camp of Transform 2014, the Lord once again reminded me that it was His grace made me possible to participate in His work. When Jesus performed the miracle of the "five loaves and two fish" to feed the four thousand, He chose to invite His disciples to serve the four thousand, so that they can experience part of God's glory. Likewise, after two thousand years, God granted me

chances to participate in His work. He also reaffirmed and encouraged me through His scriptures.

Be Well-prepared.**

We met some Muslims in London who were very willing to discuss religion with us. We even didn't have to make any opening remarks before we could introduce ourselves as Christians to discuss faith. One of the moments that left a deep impression was when we were going to set up a stall in a park to provide free face painting, we found that we forgot to bring a table. As a result, we set our stall on the grass instead. Because our stall did not look professional, we thought that no one was going to approach us.

Shortly after, two girls came to the stall and asked why we were doing face painting here. We explained that we were Christians and we would like to share with others the love of Jesus. They sat down and requested

to have "Endless love" in both Chinese and Korean painted on their hand. They were our first customers. They told us that their families were Muslims but they said nothing about themselves. Suddenly one of them asked us if we had ever experienced any miracles and if we had ever lost faith. We were surprised because these were not questions asked by those who were not serious about their belief. We tried our best to answer them and gave them some Gospel magazines. I hope that they would continue to reflect upon their faith in the future.

After this experience, I realised that all we need to do is going back to the basics, which is the Bible. It is not our words or skills, but the power of the Holy Scripture, the Word of God leading Muslims to know the Gospel.

I felt lost after I came to South Africa. Amongst the participants, there were people who were more cheerful than me,

When I first joined the worship team, I was really astonished by the talents of my teammates. They had talents for playing the piano, guitar, drums and singing. I really felt that I was not qualified to do anything for God, nor could I share my burden with others.

Thanks be to God. When I learnt to completely submit myself to God, God reminded me of the verse from 1 Corinthians 12: 4. My value was not from the gifts I had, but from the honorable identity that God gave me as His daughter. I did not need to be the best one to serve God. I felt thankful to God that the gift I possessed was tiny, but God used me to serve Him and to glorify Him.

Although different people have different gifts, we are all in one Spirit. This is not to glorify ourselves, but rather to benefit each other. I pray that we learn not to focus on comparing the gifts among each other, but to focus on God who gives us the gifts.

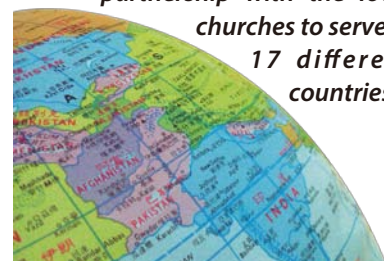
